The club has been a strong supporter of The Virginia Home, a long-term care for residents with irreversible physical disabilities, since the founding of the club in 1953. We bring cheer to the residents by maintaining the facility's garden with workdays in the fall and spring, decorating for the holiday season in December, arranging a member-provided gift for each resident for Christmas morning, and by donating the nosegay arrangements from the spring luncheon to the female residents in May.

The club is also active within our neighborhood. We help to maintain the greenspaces in the neighborhood with multiple beautification projects including bulb planting, benches installed for neighbors to relax on, and replacement of cherry trees as necessary. We also host the Easter Egg Hunt for the neighborhood children in April, and our holiday party in December is a huge hit with club members.

Our Holiday Greens Sale in October is the club's annual fundraiser. We offer garland, wreaths, poinsettias and a few potted plants to the neighborhood. Each year, the proceeds from the green's sale are bundled as a grant, awarded to a project submitted by a chosen club member. Past years' grants have provided benches for the neighborhood, a donation to The Science Museum's new native planting area, and new landscaping for our neighborhood's church entrance.

Call to Order:

President Barbara Hollister called the regular March meeting of the Richmond Council of Garden Clubs to order at 10:30 AM.

Welcome:

President Hollister welcomed members and guests. She requested that phones be placed on airplane mode for the meeting.

Invocation:

Chaplain Karla Ogden gave the invocation.

Hospitality Chairman Karen Patterson thanked Windsor Farms GC for their hospitality and food prepared for the meeting. She announced the tentative Hostess List for next year: September- Chancellor GC, October – Crown Grant GC, November -Windsordale GC and Clay Springs GC, December – Ginter Park GC, February – Roslyn Hills GC, March – Powhatan GC, April has yet to be assigned.

Registrar:

Bonnie Parker reported 87 members including 1 associate. 22 clubs were represented. The chair reported a quorum was present, so business proceeded. Johanna circulated a sign-up sheet for clubs to sign up to donate a plant or arrangement for Fashion with Flowers.

Officer Report:

President Barbara Hollister requested that Flower Show Chairman Jennifer Wester share updates on the flower show progress. Jennifer thanked Lynne Still for writing the schedule and all who have volunteered for chairmanships. "Home for the Holidays" flower show will be held December 5, 2025, at the Church of Epiphany.

Barbara thanked those who volunteered to bring diapers for the Diaper Mission at the Church of Epiphany. The church's mission has grown with more young families in the area using this mission.

The jewelry sale is underway, and all proceeds will go to the School Gardening Program.

First Vice President Mary Penzer reported that plans were going well for the Annual May Luncheon, but they still need a member club to volunteer to make 10-13 table arrangements. The club who makes the arrangements will be reimbursed \$150 and preferential seating.

Second Vice President Janice Beatty introduced today's speaker, Jason Aldrich of "Undoing Ruin". She also asked members to contact her or Jeanne Stigall with suggestions for new speakers and program ideas for the coming year.

Minutes:

The minutes for the February meeting were approved and shared in the March newsletter. The minutes of today's meeting were taken by Recording Secretary pro tem Susan DelSordo and will be reviewed by Jennifer Wester, Janice Beatty, and Mary Penzer.

Parliamentarian: Sandra Walker – absent. Barbara gave a brief update on Sandra's recovery from surgery in the fall. She shared that Sandra is improving.

Standing Committee Reports:

Awards: Judy Durant encouraged clubs to apply for the Metropolitan Landscape Design Grant and the J. Malcolm Pace Awards by April 1, 2025.

Conservation: Evelyn Klumb encouraged members to plant native plants, plant seeds, and grow plants that don't require a lot of water.

Life Membership: Kay Rafner – absent.

Nature Camp: Lynne Still reported that the Nature Camp Foundation will hold its 2nd Annual Spring Art Day on April 12, 2025. Arts and Crafts instructors will teach how to make garden butterfly puddlers, watercolor botanical prints, nature photography and writing, and more. Register on the Nature Camp website to attend. Morning and afternoon sessions cost \$40.

Recycle Pop Tabs: Barbara announced there were many pop-tabs collected today.

School Gardening: Martie Parch reminded members to ask their clubs to donate to School Gardening. The funds collected go to the five area Master Gardeners Associations, which includes: Chesterfield, Henrico, Hanover, Goochland/Powhatan and Richmond, all of which have school gardening programs.

Ways and Means: Barbara Hollister reported proceeds from Fashion with Flowers goes to Nature Camp. Fashion with Flowers is on April 3, 2025, at 1st Baptist Church, 2709 Monument Ave, Richmond, VA. Barbara encouraged attendees to come early for parking. The program begins at 10:00 AM. The parking lot immediately behind the church is handicap parking only.
